How to be Successful in Language Arts

Grading System

Your language arts grade is made up of the following:



- Assessments 60% (Ex: Unit Tests, Vocab Quizzes, Accelerated Reader
- Homework 25%

Class Work & Participation 15%

Do not expect extra credit. Do not expect to redo assignments for a new grade. Expect to do your best and earn the grade you deserve.

Reading Goals & Accelerated Reader

Throughout the year you will take reading tests to determine your reading level. Your AR point goal is based on your reading level and reading 30 minutes each day for 9 weeks, so goals will differ amongst students.

It is very important to keep up with up your reading throughout the year! Accelerated Reader makes up 2 assessment grades per quarter: <u>1) Quiz Average and 2) Percent of Point Goal</u> <u>Met</u>. Your goal is at least an 85% quiz average and 100% of your point goal met.

To check your progress log into Renaissance Learning just as if you were taking an AR quiz and view your reports. (Parents/guardians may also check progress using their child's log-in info.)

Late Work Policy

Assignments are used to help you reach your reading and writing goals. It is crucial to your academic development (and grade!) that you take time to complete and turn in your work. If work is turned in late, you will automatically <u>lose half of the total points</u>, so that the highest percentage earned is a 50% on the assignment. You have until the end of the unit to turn in any late work assigned during the unit.

Make Up Work

When absent, check the class agenda & your peers for missed class work. It's up to you to find out what you've missed!
