- 6. Can I give a clear description of when I met my goal? (Who, What, Where, When, & How)
- 7. Can I show evidence that I met my goal? (See examples below.)

Types of Evidence

Use at least one of the following types of evidence to prove that you met your goal:

- 1. Photograph
- 2. Video
- 3. Report from Eye Witness
- 4. Formal Document
